'TWEEN RUFFLE SCARF

(For 10 years and older)



In the last two BB&B sales we sold LOTS of ruffle scarves. For adults, these scarves may have run their course BUT they are all the rage for the younger set. Pick bright, happy colours for these younger fashionistas.

YOU NEED

4.5mm needles

I Ball Starbella Neon Premier Yarn (or any brightly colored ball of 'Ruffle' yarn). One ball makes two scarves measuring 2.5" x 42"

Needle and matching thread

DIRECTIONS

Pull out a length of yarn and open it up. The holes are at the top thinner edge of the yarn.

Count to the fourth hole from the left, then fold it in half over the next four holes, with the raw edge of the yarn to the back. You are overlapping the yarn for ease of working the end in late.

Insert the right needle into 4 of the double loops along the top edge, working from back to front. You will have 4 stitches on your needle.

Turn the needle clockwise and knit into each of the 4 stitches, using I consecutive hole in the strand of yarn for each stitch.

Continue knitting the 4 stitches, always turning clockwise as you go. This keeps the scarf going round in a circle.

Knit until scarf reaches 42". Bind off loosely.

Trim leaving a 3" tail. Take needle and thread, fold under the corner and tack the inside.

PILLOWCASES GALORE!

Kids' pillowcases in bright, modern, cheerful fabrics sold well last year.

They are easy to make with neatly sewn French seams and contrasting or coordinating top cuff and accent fabrics.

There are just a few basics for sewing a great pillowcase.



- I. Wash and press all fabric before sewing.
- 2. Use thread that matches your fabric.
- Use the tube method and french seams to enclose all raw edges.
- 4. Back stitch securely on the same stitching line.

There are many tube pillowcase tutorials, videos and patterns available on line. The first pillowcase may take a bit of time as you follow the instructions but after that it is a quick and easy evening project.

HERE is a short video that shows the tube technique and french seams. Forgive the presenter as she calls the pillowcase a quilt many times during the video. Her techniques are very good.
