#### UPDATES FROM CUSTODIANS

This month, we have an update from Eveline Goodall - the new JEWELRY Custodian.

There was a tremendous growth in the number of jewelry items for sale at the 2014 BB&B; 759 items as compared to 210 items in 2012. Looks like BB&B is a good place to shop for unique, well-priced jewelry.

And PETS this year will be managed by Carol Spring and Norma Wilson. Norma and Carol are keen to get a few new items for PETS as in 2015 the selection we had sold out and they are sure there is more market.



# JEWELRY-WHAT SELLS

## **NECKLACES**

Necklaces are amongst our big sellers. There is usually a great range of products in this category. Keep up the good work. The individual bead charms on leather necklaces sold very well. I-cord still sells. All colours are attractive to buyers.

#### **BRACELETS**



Bracelets are another top seller and the beaded bracelets, particularly the ones with closures were best sellers. Cuffs sold well as did Friendship bracelets. Please pay attention to size. Optimal size seems to be 6.5 to 7.7 inches circumference.

### **PINS**

We have some pins left from last year's sale, and while we may have saturated the market with wooden shawl pins, beaded shawl pins, lapel and other embellished pins still sold very well.

## LITTLE GIRLS' ITEMS

We didn't have a lot but barrettes and barrettes with cases sold out as did hairbands and scrunchies. A few of the traditional-style button bracelets sold in this category as well. Items for girls are very popular and guess what? Pink and purple are the favoured colours.

### **CERAMIC BUTTONS**

These sell nicely. In 2015 sets of 4 and 5 sold better than singles or even doubles. There is a two-day, clay button workshop on May 31 and June 14.

### OTHER ITEMS

We sold about half of the earrings we had and still have 29 pairs for next year. They have been a slow seller for some reason. Needle cases sold nicely as did bead-, charm- and button-embellished zipper pulls, purse charms and key fobs.

There are at least eight Members making jewelry. New "Jewelers" are very welcome to join. Eveline is located in NW Calgary and you can drop off your products to her directly or bring them to the north or south gatherings. She says she will even do pick-up if that is what suits you best. #### **PET PRODUCTS**

In 2014, we had a much reduced PET section due to limited products. This year we are hoping to expand this product line a bit. At the June 10 Demo Day, we will have a demo devoted to pet products so drop into that if you are looking for ideas.

Felted, catnip mice (pictured on page 1) continue to amaze us with their popularity. In 2015 we had over 80 and virtually sold out. We usually have them in every colour of the rainbow and every mouse leaves us with a unique name.

This year, consider food mats for either dogs or cats. These are not more complex than quilted placemats with appropriate themed fabric or appliqué. It can be quite fun to let your imagination take over with the pet theme.

Dog beds always sell quite well as do toys for both cats and dogs. We will have examples in the June demo.



Or how about a furniture protector for when pets want to share the people furniture. These are essentially a lap quilt and can be made from a variety of fabrics.

We have found in the past that dog coats are harder to sell than other items as sizing can be an issue. Most shoppers do not have their pooch with them and are hesitant to buy without trying coats on. So while they can be fun to make, non-sized items are preferred.
