TWO-DAY CLAY WORKSHOP MAY 29 & JUNE 5

Join UJAMAA GRANDMAS for a rerun of the popular two-day workshop with Tracy Franks, local ceramics artist and teacher. Make buttons, pendants, shawl pins, trivets and other items that can be added to our handcrafted items or sold at 2016 BB&B sale.

On Day 1, Sunday May 29 from 1:00 to 4:00 PM, create your clay pieces. These will be fired during the following weeks. On Day 2, Sunday June 5 from 1:00 to 4:00 PM, glaze the fired pieces in preparation for the final firing. Your pieces should be ready for pickup the next week.

ARTIST TRADING CARDS - ATC

Bet you can't make just one!

Once you start it is hard to stop as the ideas just seem to keep coming. An ATC is usually 2.5 x 3.5 inches but you can make a post card size if you prefer. Use paper, fabric, yarn, felt, beads, paint, ink or a combinations of any or all of these media. Some like to start with a playing card and build on that. Quilt, hand embroider, crochet, bead, paint, stamp, layer, fuse or emboss until you have a little treasure to bring along to trade for another little treasure. If you bring a card, you can take a different card away at the end of the day. We will have a table dedicated to showcasing the cards all day long.

Any sentiment or subject matter will do but you might like to make an ATC that reflects to the sister-ship that exists amongst the UJAMAA GRANDMAS. Felt? Quilt? Fuse? Paint? Knit? So many choices.
