## **Microwave Bowls**

## Supplies:

All cotton fabric, batting and thread

- 2 10" squares fabric
- 2 10" squares batting

The size may be adjusted larger to fit different size serving bowls. Be sure the size will fit into the microwave. 12 - 14" will work.

- 1. Fold fabric squares in half and clip the edge to mark the center of each side.
- 2. Layer batting and fabric squares and with fabric side up stitch diagonally across. Using the side clips as marking, stitch across the fabric in both directions.
- 3. Using the stitch lines as a guide mark 1 inch to the left of the stitch lines along the edge of the fabric. Fold the edge down to find half way mark (2 ½") along the straight stitching line. Mark this for the end of the dart.
- 4. Using the markings, sew the four darts on each of the fabric squares. End the dart slightly above the 2 ½" marking. Backstitching will be hidden in the batting.
- 5. Trim the darts. Trim the batting away from each side of the dart. Press to one side.
- 6. Match the two squares right sides together and pin at corners and darts. Sew with a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " to a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam. Leave an opening to turn right side out.
- 7. Trim batting to the seam allowance. Clip through the seam allowance beside the dart several times but do not clip the stitching.
- 8. Turn right side out. Use a chopstick to push out the corners.

  Top stitch carefully along edge making sure that the opening is sewn neatly closed.
- 9. Do a second row of top stitching  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the first row of top stitching

Admire the finished product.
