The online sign up forms are available at this <u>LINK</u>. Signing up is as easy as 1, 2, 3.

There are four time slots over the course of the sale.

- 3. Fill in the form name, email and where you want to work and submit.

If your form was received, you will see a confirmation message. If you want to work more than one time slot go back to the <u>REGISTER</u> page and fill in another form.

By October 9 you will get an email with information about when and where you will be needed and specific instructions.

When the sale is over it is a good time to kick back a bit and perhaps to learn a few new tricks. There are a number of great on-line resources for knitters and crocheters where we can hone our old skills and pick up a few new stitches.

For the sewing and quilting members, the second part of this list includes sites which hold appeal to both knitters and the sewing crafters.



RAVELRY

We have talked about Ravelry in the past but it is such a great resource for everything knitting - patterns, both free and inexpensive, feedback on

patterns by those who have already given them a try, new and/or unique project ideas, yarn info and well, just name it and if it is about knitting or crochet, you will find it on Ravelry.

Create a user id and password and sign on.



VERY PINK

If you need a tutorial or video or a kick start for a new idea, check out this site and companion blog by a master. Staci is primarily a knitter so her crochet techniques are focused on crochet for

knitters. Never hurts to stretch a bit. Staci also has a Ravelry presence.



DROPS

You will find more than 60,000 - yes, you read that right, 60,000 - patterns on this site. Many are designed for their own yarns but substitutions are easy.

Instructions come in a dozen languages. Their yarn is

available for sale on the site.

Or how about **KNITTY**, online Knitters magazine? And **PATTERNFISH**, a source of over 14,000 (YIKES!) patterns.

Oh, and check out **TWIST COLLECTIVE**.

There are many more but these a few of my favourites.



Sites that may appeal to knitters and sewers.



PURL BEE

Don't let the name fool you. Purl Bee is a wonderful, multicraft, open-access site. No id or password and no sign in. All patterns and instructions are free.

There is a great, easy-to-use index of projects sorted into crochet, knit, sew, embroider, weave and craft. Or use their search function.

No need to say that there is something for everyone here. I have made several project from this resource or seen something that inspired me to try something new.



CRAFTSY

This is a learning site which provides online, on-demand, work-along classes and workshops and also carries individual patterns. All are reasonably priced and often offered at sale prices.

Classes and workshops run the gamut from basic through advanced skills. Most have a class-only pattern included with step-by-step work along through the project.

Instructors are experts in their field and you feel you know them by the end of the sessions. Ask questions throughout the class or workshop and post photos of finished projects. The difference between a class and a workshop? In a class the instructor is almost live to answer questions. In a workshop, participants help each other along the way. Either way there is lots of interaction if you want it.

You have to sign up and you can opt in or out of their email. I opt in so as not miss any new stuff. Craftsy also has an IPad platform so anything you sign up for on your computer can be watched on your IPad. I know lots of you have one!
